## Conceived Vision

Indeed, I am fortunate enough to have an opportunity to work in ICIS project since beginning. This experience is really unique one. I take opportunity to share vision and thought process conceived during early phases of ICIS.

Development of ICIS in WRD has started in real sense in January 2007 when M/S Pricewaterhouse Coopers (PwC) were appointed as Project Management Consultant. In developing ICIS methodical approach was adopted. Instead of going straightway for development of ICIS various business processes of WRD were identified and mapped in flow chart format. In all 86 core plus 17 support processes were mapped. The document As-Is Report so prepared was vetted by domain experts of WRD and finally approved in ICIS implementation committee in September 2007.

In second phase Business Process Reengineering was done. Processes captured in As-Is Study were reviewed in brainstorming sessions of senior officers of WRD conducted in December 2007 and January 2008. The processes were reengineered considering inputs received in brain storming session of domain experts, best practices followed elsewhere in the country and at international level and IT enableness. Processes, which have become redundant with age, were either removed or reengineered to suit the existing scenario. In doing so concerns of the stakeholders at various levels are taken into consideration. These reengineered processes were mapped in flow chart formats. These process flow charts are now being atomized with suitable IT solutions.

This base work took almost two years. But in my opinion it was essential as there was no sense in automising outdated workflow. Now, I believe that final product will suit the current scenario and fulfill the expectations of entire spectrum of WRD stakeholders. I request all the employees of WRD to go through "To-Be" document which is available on [www.kdcpune.org](http://www.kdcpune.org). This document gives standardized procedures for all WRD business processes. It will help in bringing uniformity in working throughout the state. Although, these benefits will be automatically achieved once the ICIS is successfully implemented it is also useful even at stage while carrying out various day to day activities manually. If employees start doing their work by referring these documents they will be conversant with various steps that will have to be followed in near future in automated workflow. These work flow will be especially useful to new recruits in the department for their day to day working.
